School Counselor will collaborate with the student services team to determine the best counseling provider.

#### Referral Given to Provider:

School Counselor gives signed Permission to Refer to the Provider and communicates about the student.

## Consent & Counseling Services Initiated:

Counseling agency receives parental consent, and the School Counselor works with providers to coordinate location and times for services at school.

## Counseling Services Monitored:

Counseling agencies will provide monthly summaries of services to the School Counselor. The School Counselor will navigate any concerns in the process.

### Discharge Summary:

Discharge is indicated on their monthly summary which is given to the School Counselor.

## What is Alpha?

The Alpha Program offers FREE Academic Support and Life Skills Classes to each grade. I spend time weekly assisting teachers and providing lessons to students on character building, social, and life skills. Additionally, Alpha can provide individual and/or group counseling to any student, Kindergarten-5th grade who is referred to our program. Students can receive FREE one-on-one and/or group counseling to address issues such as self-esteem, grief/loss, social skills, family issues, academics, anger management, coping skills or stress/anxiety; all offered in-person and/or virtually.

Alpha program receives funding from the the Citizens' Commission for Children (CCC) in addition to funding from Orange County. It is for this reason that the Alpha program is required to provide documentation to help assess the program's impact and efficacy at Engelwood Elementary. This includes tracking students' progress through grades, discipline referrals and attendance records.

If you wish for your student to receive any services provided by the Alpha program, all consents must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian on behalf of the student.
